



Canon Chaigneau Background

Country / Region: France / Bordeaux

Description: Canon Chaigneau is one of Lalande-de-Pomerol's leading estates with a centuries-long history and an enviable location on the Neac plateau just north of Pomerol. The estate boasts sloping vineyards planted on the same iron-rich clay and limestone soils as its illustrious neighbor to the south. Purchased recently by London-born wine merchant Romik Arconian, the wines are made by Thierry Garnaud, famed ex-cellar master of Cheval Blanc from 1988-2018. Unsurprisingly given this pedigree, in recent years the chateau has enjoyed significant critical acclaim.

Wine Notes - 2019 Canon Chaigneau, Lalande-de-Pomerol

Canon Chaigneau is made from a blend of 93% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc and 2% Malbec grown in the estate's 40-year old vineyards. These vineyards boast the same iron-rich clay and limestone soils of the great chateaux of nearby Pomerol. The fruit is 95% destemmed and 5% whole-cluster which is fermented in cement cuves for 15 days (with 3 days of lees contact). The juice is then aged for 20 months in a mix of cement and 220-liter French-oak barrels before light filtering and bottling. The finished wine then spends additional time in bottle prior to release. Hailing from the excellent 2019 vintage, the result is a classic Right Bank 'iron glove in a velvet fist' with a beguiling mix of ripe, round red and black fruit notes, silky tannins and a long, structured finish. It is little surprise that the wine has garnered widespread acclaim.

Ratings Information

Impeccably made wine, the 2019 Canon Chaigneau sports a dense purple hue as well as a great nose of wild strawberries, darker cherries, leafy herbs, and spring flowers. Soft, supple, balanced, and just delicious, it's a terrific buy for those looking for a great Bordeaux to drink over the coming decade..

Dark plums, currants, mushrooms, walnuts and undergrowth on the nose. Medium-to full-bodied with firm, fleshy tannins. Savory mushroom and olive notes on the chewy finish. Drink from 2024.

The 2019 Canon Chaigneau has more fruit on the nose compared to the Cuve 8A, though that is partly because it is less reduced. The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannins and fleshier than the Cuve 8A, quite substantial yet focused, with a judicious touch of white pepper on the aftertaste. Excellent.

The 2019 Canon Chaigneau is showing very nicely from bottle, offering up pretty aromas of cherries, blackcurrants and plums, followed by a medium to full-bodied, velvety and fleshy palate with a ripe core of fruit, powdery tannins and succulent acids. This is quite a dense, rich wine, but its flavors are more vibrant and its overall balance compelling.
