**Description:** Third-generation native Stephane Pichat is one of the young superstars of the northern Rhone. He has 10 acres of vineyards in Cote Rotie, spread across multiple parcels each of which is naturally farmed according to the specific needs of each terroir. Since starting his eponymous domaine in 2000 while in his mid 20s, Pichat has garnered extensive acclaim and his bottlings are

now Cotie Rotie benchmarks.

## Wine Notes – 2016 Domaine Pichat Cote Rotie Grandes Places

Les Grandes Places is Domaine Pichat's top Cote Rotie cuvee. Now widely acclaimed as among the finest Cote Rotie's being produced, the grapes are entirely sourced from Pichat's Grandes Places lieu-dit, which is located in the northern, iron-rich schist soils of the Cote Brune sector of the appellation. Pichat's winemaking emphasizes purity and the natural qualities of the grapes, with whole-cluster fermentation and aging in large oak barrels.

Fermented with the stems, the medium to full-bodied 2016 Cote Rotie Les Grandes Places reflects that to some extent in its complex aromas of bay leaf, mint, green olives and raspberries. Like the other 2016s from Pichat, it's firm and tannic, yet it seems to have the requisite concentration to age well

The 2016 Cote Rotie Les Grandes Places is also beautifully concentrated, especially in this vintage. From an incredible terroir in the northern part of the appellation, it was fermented with no destemming and will spend two years in new French oak. It gives up sensational notes of black currents, caramelized black cherries, smoked earth, espresso and cured meats. Thick, unctuous and pure with a rounded, opulent texture, it's easily one of the most impressive releases in the vintage. Don't miss it!
