

Tellurian Background

Description: Founded in 2002, Tellurian's vineyards sit in the middle of the world class wine region of Heathcote in Victoria, Australia. Tellurian has been certified organic since 2018 and produces outstanding expressions of Australian Shiraz and other classic Rhône, Italian and Mediterranean varietals. The winery has repeatedly been ranked as a Five Star winery by James Halliday, Australia's foremost wine critic.

Wine Notes – 2018 Tellurian Pastiche Shiraz

Tellurian has been a world class producer of Rhone and other Mediterranean varietals since its founding in 2002. Driven by founder Ian Hopkins' passion for Heathcote Shiraz and the talents of winemaker Tobias Ansted, Tellurian has developed a reputation for outstanding small batch production of warm climate varietals. The Pastiche Shiraz is made from estate-grown grapes grown in 550 million year old Cambrian soils of decomposed greenstone rock and limestone. Fermented in large open-top fermenters, with extended skin contact and use of artisanal winemaking techniques such as hand plunging and aged primarily in seasoned French oak, the resulting wine is a medium-bodied, deep purple gem that faithfully reflects its Heathcote roots. Aromas of dark berry fruit, cherry and plum along with a small amount of spice show through from the oak. The palate is dominated by dark fruit along with vanilla and spice. Soft tannins allow the wine to be enjoyed young, yet still provide a firm framework for subtle complexity.

One year bottle age prior to release

*Delivers intriguing notes of chicory, mocha and sandalwood that add an aromatic edge to the maraschino cherry and raspberry flavors. Offers a juicy frame, with spice notes and a hint of cedar lingering on the finish. Drink now through 2036. **92 Points***



*This starts out lucidly but rather densely, with aromas of terra cotta, pepper, savory spice and chocolate framing ripe cassis and blueberry fruit. Medium weight, the plump fruit is tempered by dusty, savory tannins and some intriguing secondary flavors. It's on the warm side, alcohol-wise. Captures the concentration and power but also the freshness of Heathcote. **90 Points***
