## TRIENNES

Two of Burgundy's greatest names – Jacques Seysses, founder of Domaine Dujac, and Aubert de Villaine, co-owner of Domaine de la Romanée-Conti – are the partners behind this pioneering property in Provence, northeast of Marseille and due east of Aix-en-Provence. Over the years, they have transformed this stunning 46-hectare site into one of the top wine estates in Southern France.

## THE WINE

### Vineyard Profile

Triennes has invested heavily in its vineyards from the beginning. An ambitious replanting program started the program, and 2008 saw the start of organic conversions.

- Soils: Clay and limestone
- Aim: Create a healthy vineyard, choosing vines & rootstocks adapted to the growing conditions
- Farming: As natural as possible; cover crop grown every 2nd row to control vigor, limit erosion & assimilate organic material.

### Harvest Notes

- Harvested at night so the grapes are cool upon arrival at winery
- Pressed after a few hours of skin contact
- Fermented at low temperature until dry in stainless steel tanks

### Winemaker's Notes

This pale pink wine has a bouquet of strawberries and white flowers with hints of vanilla. It has the harmony and elegance that has earned world-wide appreciation of the rosés of Provence. Triennes Rosé is the perfect accompaniment to a sunny summer afternoon.

### Technical Information

- Primarily Cinsault, with Grenache, Syrah and Merlot
- Alcohol: 12.7%
- Total Acidity: 3.62 g/l
- Residual Sugar: <1 g/l
